Public safety services

Uniformed Services -

they immediately respond to any incidents
and undertake preventive actions.

They provide necessary information regarding facilities
and safety requirements,
and if necessary also give first aid.



Emergency Medical Services -

rescue workers in red uniforms will assist
and help in emergency situations.

Each time, in a situation of danger to life, health or property of citizens
please call the emergency number 112.

Your report will be immediately given to the competent services.
Please remember, the speed and effectiveness of intervention depends
on how you pass the information about emergency to the operator

Public safety services

"MY POLICE STATION"

My Police Station (Polish: „Moja Komenda”) is a mobile app that provides each user with quick access to information about the addresses and telephone numbers of police services.

It was developed for people who come into contact with the police in real-life situations that do not include life or health emergency.

The "My Police Station" app contains a database of contact details of all police forces, headquarters and stations in Poland. It is equipped with two search modes. When you turn on location services on your phone, the app itself will find the nearest police facility. When you are online, it needs just one click to indicate the route to the nearest police station, or headquarters. Just as efficiently, it connects us to duty officers of the selected unit. In addition, the "My Police Station" allows you to search by unit, street name, or post code.

Meet some aspects of Polish law

Disturbance of public order and immoral or hooligan behavior

are punishable by jail time.

Curfew applies from 10 p.m. till 6 a.m.



Alcohol consumption and smoking in public places

are punishable by fine.

Alcohol and cigarettes are sold to people over 18 years old



Driving under the influence of drugs and / or alcohol

is punishable by up to two years in prison.

Possession of drugs and sales is prohibited

Violation of the bodily integrity of a public officer during

or in connection with his/her performance of official duties

is punishable by imprisonment up to 3 years,

and for his/her insulting – up to 1 year.



Bursting into the mass event and on the area where

the mass event takes place,

wearing dangerous tools and covering face

is punishable by imprisonment for up to 1 year.

How to avoid being a crime victim



Beware of dangerous situations!

If you have a reasonable suspicion that you may become a victim of crime, notify the police immediately.



Avoid places less frequented, particularly during evenings and night.

Always have someone accompany you.

Do not carry large amounts of cash with you.

Do not make casual acquaintance with people encountered by chance.

Remember, opportunity makes the thief!



While in public transport, shops, train stations and streets, please pay attention to the people nearby.

Hold the bag or backpack in front of you.

Do not show the contents of your wallet.

Do not carry money and a mobile phone in the outer pockets of your clothing. Do not leave your luggage unattended.

While driving or leaving the car in the parking lot do not leave valuables in plain sight. Try to park in guarded areas, avoid unlit areas.

How to avoid being a crime victim



Take care of the safety of your child!

Immediately notify the relevant departments if a child is missing.

**What to do when a child is suddenly lost?
Search on your own?
Notify the police?**

The most common situation to lose a child is in a crowd,
at the airport, train station, at the festival or concert.

Therefore: Watch your child.

Do not leave him/her alone.

Explain how to behave when you have lost your way.
Show who are the people you can trust (the policeman,
rescue worker, lifeguard, firefighter).

Provide child with a badge with contact details
and/or an easy-to-use mobile phone.

Dress your child with bright-colored clothes.

Think of the meeting place,
in case of such situation, and show it to your child.

How to avoid being a crime victim

Beware of counterfeit money and fake products!



If you are in doubt as to the authenticity of a banknote, report to the nearest police department or the bank for checking. Fake banknotes and coins are subject to forfeiture, without the right to get a refund of equivalent

Touch, look, tilt, check!
Poland does not belong to the Euro zone.
The official currency is the Polish zloty (zł or PLN).



Consider whether giving is helping!

For many people, begging is a choice, not a necessity! They are public institutions and non-governmental organizations that deal with the people in need.

If observed situation for some reason raises your anxiety (e.g. it involves a child or begging person is pushy, aggressive or poses a threat to the health or life of his own and others) please report the incident to the City Guard (call 986) or the Police (call 997).

Basic traffic rules for drivers



Poland has right-hand traffic.

The driver is obliged to have: driving license, vehicle registration document and valid insurance policy. Travelers from outside the European Union are also requested to have a Green Card.



The permissible content of alcohol in blood is up to 0.2 percent.

You must always drive with dipped headlights on.



The elements of mandatory car equipment are a warning triangle and a fire extinguisher. For your own safety, please also carry first aid kit and a reflective vest.

It is obligatory to wear a seat belt in both the front and rear seats.



Children under 12 years of age or who do not exceed 150 cm height must travel in car seats.

Using a mobile phone hand-held while driving is prohibited.

Consular officers' service

For safety reasons, you **must have** an identity document on you. Citizens of certain countries must have a valid travel document and a visa.

Transport safety

Lodz Airport named after Reymont

(Ul. Gen. S. Maczka 35) keeps service standards similar to other Polish regional airports. Terminals prepared for this ensure a high level of passenger service in domestic and international traffic.

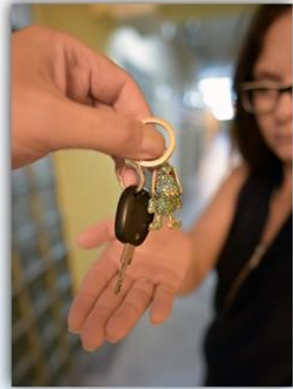

Transport safety.

You can also use the services of taxi companies

Warning! Before you get into a taxi and decide on a route, check the price. The rate per kilometer should be placed on the door of the car. The fare for 1 km of travel depends on the time of day, area (urban, suburban) and different price lists made by corporations.



If you reach Poland by other means of transport and want to rent a car, you can do it at the airport or private car rental companies throughout the country.



Remember that some highways in Poland are payable. The fare depends on the category of the vehicle and the length of the route. On highways, there is a possibility of payment in cash (PLN, USD, EUR) and bank cards

When you are involved in an accident with fatalities or injuries provide necessary assistance and call emergency medical services and the police.

Do not take actions that may prevent recalling the sequence of the accident.
